Pawlikowski, O.S.M. Prior to his studies at Yeshiva University, Rabbi Levy completed undergraduate studies in the joint program of Columbia University and The Jewish Theological Seminary of America. Currently Rabbi Levy lives in Israel, in the Galilee, with his wife and children.
