G. David Schwartz (Jewish) is a free-lance writer living in Cincinnati, Ohio. He has a B.A. from the University of Cincinnati and an M.A. in philosophy from Miami University, Oxford, Ohio. Active in local Jewish-Christian discussion groups, he co-chairs the Northern Hills Synagogue tri-logue. Author of *A Jewish Appraisal of Dialogue: Between Talk and Theology*, (Lanham, Md., University Press of America, 1994), his articles on Jewish-Christian dialogue have appeared in *The Journal of Ecumenical Studies*, *Encounter*, *New Theology Review*, *The Jewish Spectator*, *Midstream*, and elsewhere. His paper, "Review: The Big Book of Why" in *The Washington Review* (December, 1994-January, 1995), is a 1995 nominee for a Pushcart Prize. Schwartz hosts a Jewish Studies forum for TalkCity and is cofounder of Seed House, an interfaith organization which proposes to affect social change by addressing issues which seem insolvable only from a constrained perspective.
